

The stairs symbolize a long period of 570 Million years (from the palaeozoic to the cenozoic age)

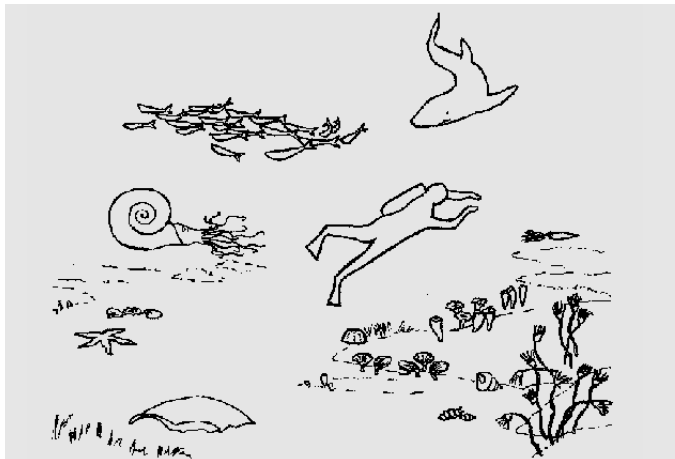
Approximately how many years does each step represent?
